English Focus: Poetry Do you know what Remembrance Sunday is or why people wear poppies? Use the power point to find out more. Read the poems about Remembrance. Can you see that each line of the poem starts with a letter of the word remember? This is called an acrostic poem. Write your own Remembrance acrostic poem on the template provided. Use the word wall on the power point to give you ideas and help with spelling.	English Focus: Poetry Read the Remembrance poems on the power point. Discuss the poems with an adult, look at the vocabulary used and the way that's the poems are set out. Write your own Remembrance poem using the word wall to give you ideas and help with spelling. Perhaps you could try to include some rhyme in your poem.	English Focus: Poetry Can you remember what an acrostic poem is? Read the autumn acrostic poems on the power point. Write your own autumn acrostic poem on the template provided. Try to include lots of adjectives to add detail to your poem Use the word wall on the power point to give you ideas and help with spelling.	English Focus: Poetry Read the autumn poems on the power point. Can you spot the rhyming words? Where are the rhyming words in each sentence? Write your own autumn rhyming poem. There are some rhyming words related to autumn at the end of the power point to get you started. Can you think of any more to add to your poem?	English Focus: Comprehension Read the remembrance text carefully. Complete one of the question sheets remembering to answer each question as a full sentence and to number each question in the margin. Try to choose a sheet that challenges you.

Without taking the drawing material off the paper, let the spiral mark making grow outwards, gradually involving the wrist, the elbow, the shoulder the whole body. You can experiment creating spirals using different materials, pencils, crayons, pens etc. When you have had a practise try to create your own spiral artwork.
