Cut out the cards below. Match each problem with a rule to help you stay safe.

A child is playing a game online and another player asks where they live.

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Never meet up with someone you have met online.

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A child wants to log in to a site using their friend's password.

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Get permission from a parent or carer before using the Internet.

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A child has been chatting to someone online and they suggest meeting up.

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Always use safe search engines to search for images or information.

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A child is playing a game on their mum's phone and something pops up that says 'download'.

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Never share your personal details with someone online. This includes your full name, your address, your phone number and the name of your school.

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A child takes their tablet into their room without telling their parent or carer.

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Check with a grown-up before downloading something, as it could damage the device.

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A child wants to use their computer to search for information for their school project.

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Keep your login and password details private. Only share them with your parents or carers.

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A child sees a scary video on a website they are looking at.

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Never send a picture of yourself to someone you have met on the Internet.

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A person gets asked to send a photo of themselves by someone online.

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Tell a trusted adult if you see anything on the Internet that scares, worries, upsets or confuses you.

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'Someone sends a mean message to a child when they are playing online and says they are going to hurt them when they see them at school.

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Be kind online. Being mean online is cyberbullying. Tell a trusted adult if it happens to you

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
